Providing environmental job training to support local hire in rural Alaska communities

STRUCTURE OF TRAINING PROGRAM: Four weeks of training split into two sessions. Trainees attend both sets of classes in Anchorage with a two-week "Spring Break" in-between.

EXPERIENCE GAINED: Graduates receive a Program Diploma and course certifications, qualifying them for many job positions, including: Waste collector, Landfill operator, Contaminated site worker, Tank inspector, Brownfield technician, Recycling Center Manager, and many others.

UAF CREDIT: 10 University credits and completion of the new Occupational Endorsement as a Rural Waste Management & Spill Response Technician.

PLACEMENT: Job search and job retention skills taught, and placement assistance provided.

ELIGIBILITY: RACEJT is open to unemployed rural Alaska residents. Our goal is to place graduates in a local job position that facilitates their community's environmental health. Applicants with strong potential to secure local or regional employment will receive priority program acceptance. No applications accepted after November 21, 2018
