STRUCTURE OF TRAINING PROGRAM: RACEJT is a 4-week, residential style training; two weeks on, two weeks off, two weeks on. Participants must commit to all 4 weeks to attend.

TRAINING DATES: The training is held in Anchorage over two required sessions **March 22 – April 5 and April 19 – May 2, 2022**

- ◆ CPR/First Aid
- ◆ Soil and Water Quality Sampling*

COVID PLAN: The pandemic outlook will be assessed February 15th. RACEJT may switch to a remote Core Skills Program, teaching asterisked classes by phone, limited internet, and posted materials during half-days over similar time period.

EXPERIENCE GAINED: Graduates receive a Program Diploma and course certifications, qualifying them for many job positions, including Waste collector, Landfill operator, Contaminated site worker, Tank inspector, Brownfield technician, Recycling Center Manager, and many others.

COLLEGE CREDIT: Eight - ten UAF college credits earned towards the Occupational Endorsement as a Rural Waste Management & Spill Response Technician.

PLACEMENT: Job search and job retention skills taught, and placement assistance provided.

ELIGIBILITY: RACEJT is open to under employed rural Alaska residents. Our goal is to place graduates in a local job position that helps to protect community environmental health. Applicants with strong potential to secure local or regional employment will receive priority program acceptance.
